JANUARY IS NAMED AFTER JANUS, THE GOD WITH TWO FACES, ONE LOOKING FORWARD AND THE OTHER LOOKING BACK...

Janus was the Roman god of doors, choices, beginnings & endings. The first month of the year is named January after him. He is usually depicted with two faces, one on each side of the head. He was one of the earliest gods of Rome, sometimes referred to as the "god of gods" or diuom deo. He is often shown with beards on both faces, but originally, Janus was depicted with one bearded face & another one clean-shaven, which may have symbolized the moon & sun, or age & youth. He looks both towards the future & the past at the same time, one face looking back on the year departed, & one looking forward to the new year ahead. As the Roman God of Beginnings, his name was an obvious choice for the first month of the year.

activities. He also enjoys hunting and fishing and looks forward to his boys participating as they get a little older. Please join us in welcoming Cody to our wonderful team!




Martin Luther King, Jr. Day



Legislation signed in 1983 marked the birthday of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. as a federal holiday. In 1994, Congress designated the holiday as a national day of service & charged the Corporation for National & Community Service (CNCS), the federal agency that leads service & volunteering, with leading this effort. Each year, on the 3rd Monday in January, the MLK Day of Service is o served as a "day on, not a day off." MLK Day of Service is intended to empower individuals, strengthen communities, bridge barriers, create solutions to social problems, and move us closer to Dr. King's vision of a "Beloved Community." On January 15, 1967, the Green Bay Packers of the National Football League smash the American Football League's Kansas City Chiefs, 35-10, in the first-ever AFL-NFL World Championship, later known as Super Bowl I, at Memorial Coliseum in Los Angeles. Founded in 1960 as a rival to the NFL, the AFL was still finding its way in 1967, & the Packers had been heavily favored to win the game. As 60 million people tuned in to watch the action unfold on television, the Chiefs managed to keep i close for the first half, & by halftime Green Bay was



ahead just 14-10. The Packers, however, proceeded to break the game wide open, scoring three more times in the second half. Two years later, the AFL proved itself to doubters by winning its first championship, when Joe Namath led the New York Jets to an upset victory over the Baltimore Colts in Super Bowl III.

Chicken Noodle Soup 1 cup chopped celery • 2 1/2 cups wide egg noodles 1 cup chopped onion • 1 teaspoon vegetable oil • 1/3 cup cornstarch • 12 cups chicken broth • 1/4 cup water • 1 1/2 tablespoons salt • 3 cups diced, cooked chicken • 1 teaspoon poultry seasoning 1.Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil. Add egg noodles & oil, & boil for 8 minutes, or until tender. 2. In a large saucepan or Dutch oven, combine broth, salt, & poultry seasoning. Bring to a boil. Stir in celery & Drain & rinse under cool running water. onion. Reduce heat, cover, & simmer 15 minutes. 3. In a small bowl, mix cornstarch & water together until cornstarch is completely dissolved. Gradually add to soup, stirring constantly. Stir in noodles & chicken, & heat thoroughly. ENIOY!

TOP 5 AUTOMOTIVE NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTIONS

- 1. Resolve to schedule two checkups this year with a mechanic & know your maintenance history. Regardless of how well you think you know your vehicle, a well-trained, trustworthy mechanic can spot things that you might miss. - 3. Resolve to address minor problems early. It's easy to hear a strange noise in your vehicle & hope that it will go away. Don't put off minor maintenance or easy repair work. Doing so can lead to bigger problems & larger repair
- 4. Resolve to keep your car clean. Excess dirt & grime can act like sand paper, creating unnecessary abrasion that can wear down upholstery & carpeting. Purchase a good set of floor mats if your vehicle didn't come with them, & vacuum your car on a regular basis
- 5. Resolve to check on your tires & wheels. If your tires have worn unevenly or your wheels are unbalanced, vibration can cause excess stress on suspension components. Excess stress can mean extra trips to the mechanic & a hefty repair bill
